

 **IMPORTANT NOTICE:**
NEW YORK STATE BURN BAN 

New York's annual statewide burn ban is in effect to help prevent wildfires during the high-risk spring season.


 **Dates:**

March 16 – May 14 (annually)

The New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) reminds residents that residential brush burning is prohibited during this period.

 **What's Prohibited**

- Burning brush, leaves, and yard debris
- Disposal burning of any kind

 **What's Allowed**


- Small campfires and cooking fires
- Backyard fire pits (must be less than 3 feet high and 4 feet wide)

 **Never Allowed (Year-Round)**

- Burning garbage, trash, tires
- Burning treated or painted wood

 **Enforcement & Penalties**

- Enforced by NYS Forest Rangers and law enforcement
- Minimum \$500 fine for first-time violations

 **Safety Tips**

- Keep fires small and contained (under 3 ft high, 4 ft wide)
- Always have a fire extinguishing source nearby (water, sand, or shovel)
- Never leave a fire unattended
- Check local fire conditions using the DEC Fire Danger Map

 **BRUSH PICK-UP REMINDERS** 

Village Collection Guidelines

 **GENERAL GUIDELINES**

- Brush pick-up is for residential trimming only
- If you hire a contractor, they are responsible for removing all debris

 **LEAVES & SMALL MATERIAL**

- No leaf machine service in spring
- Place leaves in biodegradable bags only
- Also bag:
 - Vines
 - Root material
 - Thorny branches
 - Landscaping debris (weeds, grass clippings, timber)
-  No cans or containers — these will NOT be collected

 **BRUSH PLACEMENT RULES**

- Place brush by the roadside before 7:00 AM every Monday
- Stack piles neatly

 **SIZE REQUIREMENTS**

- Piles must be:
 - No more than 2 feet high
 - No more than 5 feet wide
- Limbs must be:
 - No more than 8 inches in diameter
- Place cut ends facing the same direction

 **IMPORTANT NOTES**

- Keep sidewalks, roads, and drains clear
- Crews will not return until the next scheduled pickup once your area is serviced
- The Village reserves the right to decline pick-up for any reason

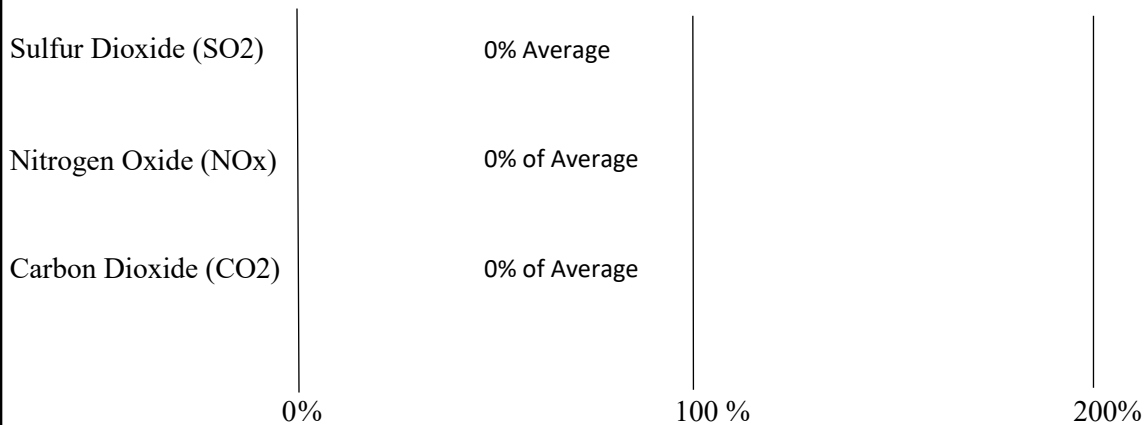
